Featured Speaker **Steve Scalise**

Steve Scalise proudly represents the First Congressional District of Louisiana, He was elected to Congress in 2008 and currently serves his colleagues as the House Republican Whip, the second highest position in House Republican leadership.



Critically wounded at a Congressional baseball practice on June 14, 2017, Scalise was saved by a heroic response from U.S. Capitol Police Special Agents and Alexandria Police Officers. Scalise fought for his life and returned to Congress, inspiring the nation with his resilience and optimism. Throughout his recovery, he was moved by the outpouring of prayers and support he and his family received from the American people.

Come hear firsthand the story told in his new book "Back in the Game: One Gunman, Countless Heroes and the Fight For My Life"

Scalise's book offers a moment-by-moment account of a gunman's June 2017 attack on the Republican congressional baseball practice in suburban Washington. A single rifle shot crushed Scalise's hip and did massive damage to his internal organs. The Jefferson Parish lawmaker spent months confined to a hospital, where infections repeatedly threatened his life. He endured intense physical therapy to relearn how to walk.

In a lot of ways the writing of this book was therapeutic because it allowed him to relive the experience in a different way, from different perspectives, Scalise said.
